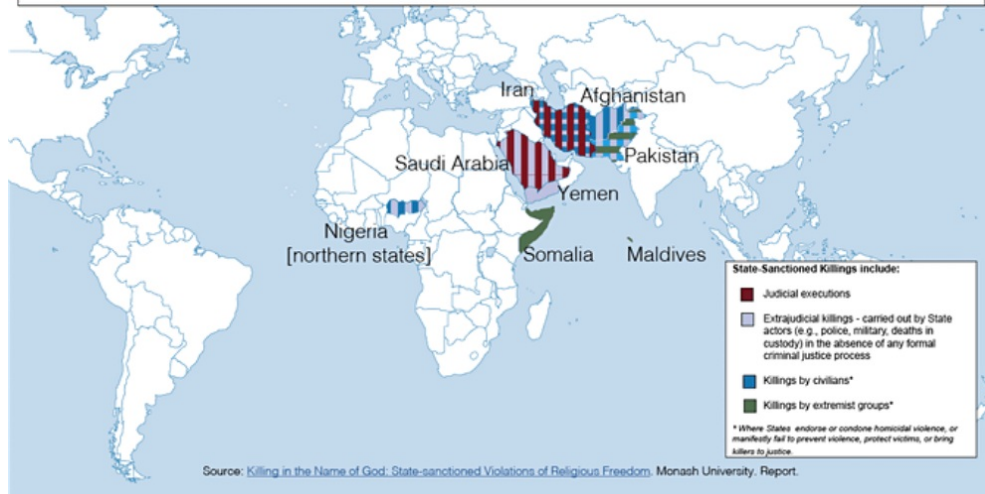

## Background

Nearly 70 UN members states have laws which penalize individuals for exercising their fundamental human rights of religion or belief and expression and at least 12 states maintain the death penalty as a punishment for the enjoyment of these rights through anti-apostasy, anti-blasphemy and related laws. Of these 12, five are members of the Human Rights Council, a membership which mandates states to uphold high human rights standards.

**Countries which maintain the death penalty for apostasy or blasphemy who have carried out state-sanctioned killings for religion or belief since 2010.**



The UN Secretary General in his annual report on the question of the death penalty made clear that the death penalty, “must never be imposed as a sanction for specific forms of nonviolent conduct such as apostasy, blasphemy, adultery, and consensual same-sex relations.” The UN Special Rapporteur on freedom of religion or belief also made an early call for the repeal of laws which restrict religious choice and expression of belief. Moreover, the UN Special Rapporteur on extrajudicial killings has noted that carrying out a death sentence for a “victimless crime,” such as apostasy and blasphemy, constitutes a form of summary or arbitrary execution.

This side-event is convened to bring together the cross-sectional advocacy regarding freedom of religion, belief, and expression, and activism to repeal the death penalty, acknowledging the “chilling effect” anti-apostasy and anti-blasphemy laws have on a plethora of other freedoms for individuals from diverse religious and belief backgrounds. The side-event will build on the Monash University Report *[Killing in the Name of God](#)* (panelist Dr. Mai Sato is one of the authors of the report in discussion) which compiled trends and patterns in the 12 states that maintain the death penalty for religion or belief and also address vulnerabilities women face as a result of these laws.
